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**Coordinated Agricultural Projects (CAP) sponsor “Combine to Kitchen Tours”**

A group of students and interns at NDSU were able to follow the processing of malting barley from “Combine to Kitchen” on July 18. A tour organized by Wheat and Barley Coordinated Agricultural Project (CAP) researchers and staff included stops at the Malt Quality Lab on the campus of North Dakota State University, the Cargill Malt Plant at Spiritwood, ND and the farm of Jim Slag near Wimbledon, ND. Fourteen students, Dr. Bill Berzonsky (NDSU Specialty Spring Wheat Breeder and a Co-Investigator for the Wheat CAP) and Karen Hertsgaard (Information Specialist for Barley CAP) organized the tours. A similar tour for the Wheat CAP was held on July 11 and included stops at the Northern Crops Institute (NCI) at NDSU, Roman Meal Milling in Fargo, ND and the North Dakota State Mill in Grand Forks, ND. Ten students attended this tour along with Dr. Berzonsky. The tours were free of charge to students courtesy of the Wheat and Barley CAPs.
