

## **Outreach Summary: Crop Management and Education Field Tours**

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**D**uring the 2007 crop season, the NDSU Carrington Research Extension Center conducted or hosted workshops and/or field tours using crop research trials and demonstration plots to provide educational opportunities for about 1000 people.
