Don't forget to work on the paperwork for your club to be recognized as a 2018-19 Healthy 4-H Club. The paperwork is due August 15 and the process is detailed on the website linked below. No preregistration is required. All members of the club receive a certificate and incentive item.

To be recognized as a Healthy North Dakota 4-H Club, clubs should complete at least one nutrition or fitness activity during **at least six meetings** (or club events) in six or more of these areas: 1) setting, 2) roll call, 3) program, 4) demonstration; 5) recreation, 6) refreshments/snacks, 7) community pride, 8) field trip/tour, 9) family mealtime challenge and 10) healthful snack policy.

4-H Record Books and Awards Day Applications

4-H Record Books and Awards Day Applications are due in the office by **Friday, August 23**. The 2018-2019 awards packet was included in the 4-H Records Books (dark blue and light blue covers).

Only TWO possible awards forms will need to be filled out: **North Dakota Key Club Award** application and **Program Award Summary** form. They are located at the end of the 4-H Record Book.

The Award Selection Committee will make the determination of who receives awards by reviewing the 4-H member's 4-H Record Book and/or additional project records. So make sure your 4-H Record Books and additional project records are completely finished.

Members must turn in a completed record book even if they are not applying for awards. A completed record book will have at least one project record filled out. Cloverbuds are not eligible for awards or first year t-shirts, but they are encouraged to submit their record books as well.
