- 1. Avoidance and embarrassment

 - b. Many have never experienced losses this large
 - c. Still have unharvested corn
- 2. What if farmers refuse to keep records?

 - b. Buy software and never use it
 - c. Rely on a spouse who isn't interested, or works off the farm
 - d. Even if they use a bookkeeping service, they still need to understand their records
- 3. What if farmers refuse to sell because "they can't give it away"?
 - a. Very little optimism for higher prices
 - b. Sell because they need to sell and not because they want to
 - c. Holding grain has been very expensive this year, and farmers feel stuck
- 4. Younger generation unaware of cash squeeze
 - a. Dad has always paid me [fill in blank]

- 5. Turnover in loan officers
 - a. Farmers not developing relationships with their lenders
 - b. Does this young kid understand me?
