Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA)

Public Value Statement

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a national multi-species quality assurance program focusing on: food safety, animal well-being, and character development. The YQCA program empowers youth with the knowledge to be future leaders who positively contribute our agricultural industry.

The Situation

The Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) program is based on integrity and thoughtful, responsible management of animals. North Dakota 4-H'ers hold the responsibility to ensure production of safe, high-quality, meat from raising market animals for consumers and their families. When our future leaders of agriculture learn the ideals of quality assurance, they understand the importance and are driven to provide a food animal product preferred by consumers and to ensure a safe, wholesome food animal product. Food animals being those whose products (meat, milk and eggs) have the potential to become part of the food chain. Food safety is paramount to animal agriculture, assuring consumer acceptance and confidence in a market. Furthermore, where animal welfare in agricultural livestock production is a huge concern, quality assurance can help educate our youth on the importance of animal well-bring. These leaders then contribute to the future of North Dakota's agricultural industry not only by being empowered with sciencebased knowledge for their own development, but to also learn how to communicate this knowledge as they become informed producers, consumers, and/or employees in the agriculture and food industry.

Extension Response

North Dakota 4-H partnered with YQCA in 2017 to offer a certification in YQCA for youth in the state of North Dakota. The YQCA program encourages young people to practice and develop responsibility of caring for animals, leadership roles and community involvement, as well as becoming educated on issues that affect the agriculture and food industry. 4-H youth that show livestock at the North Dakota State Fair 4-H shows are required to be YQCA certified. To date, 19 counties have deemed YQCA a requirement for their County Fair or Achievement Days.

Impacts

298 youth were officially YQCA certified in 2020.
