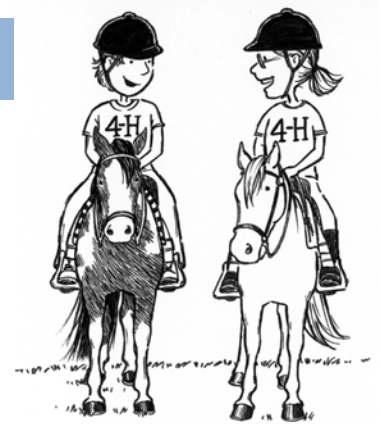

DRESS CODE: All members participating in LaMoure County 4-H Achievement Days competitive events will be neatly dressed and must wear a solid-colored white, yellow, gray or green shirt/blouse with the 4-H emblem prominently displayed and securely fastened on the front. We recommend that participants/exhibitors wear dark jeans/slacks/skirts. Boots or protective shoes are recommended for safety. *No hats, open toe or tennis shoes are allowed in the show ring. Judge may use discretion to excuse an exhibitor for dress code violation.*

Participants in the 4-H horse show will be neatly dressed and must wear a long-sleeved, solid white shirt with the 4-H emblem on the front. In addition, exhibitors must wear ASTM-SEI approved harness helmets for all mounted events (Western hats are permitted for showmanship), Western boots, blue or black jeans (dark colored) and a belt. For English events: Conservative-colored coat, breeches or jodhpurs, and boots appropriate for hunter classes. Colored shirts are permissible. Conservative-colored ASTM helmet with harness securely fastened must be worn when mounted. Gloves are permitted only in English events. Please refer to the ND State Fair 4-H Division Exhibit List.

LIVESTOCK & HORSE EVENT DETAILS

WEDNESDAY REGISTRATION

- 🔑 North Side of 4-H Barn at 1:00 p.m.
- 🔑 Receive stall/cage tag, exhibitor tag and show schedule
- 🔑 All animals should be staged at the North side of the barn
- 🔑 Showing will be in South arena of barn
- 🔑 Exhibitors must watch show schedule and be prepared to go on when Division is announced
- 🔑 All animals are subject to inspection and may be disqualified or removed if determined unfit or unhealthy

THURSDAY REGISTRATION

- 🔑 Triple R Coteau Clubhouse at 10:30 a.m.
- 🔑 Receive exhibitor number, patterns & horse show order
- 🔑 Start time is 11:00 a.m. Horse show order will follow in sequence or per judge's discretion
- 🔑 Entrants must be ready at the time they are called
- 🔑 Exhibitors are limited to two animals for the show
- 🔑 GBH092 *North Dakota Horse Show Rules* (dated May 2012) will apply
- 🔑 The judge's decision in all classes is final
- 🔑 Grand and Reserve premium ribbons are awarded at the judge's discretion. There may be times when premium ribbons are not awarded in a class.
- 🔑 Open class participants from other counties are not eligible for Grand and Reserve premium ribbons or cash premiums. Blue, Red and White ribbons will be awarded.

ALERT

**All animals to be exhibited must follow the guidelines
on pages 8-13 of the State Fair Exhibit List**

- ❗ All animals are subject to inspection and may be disqualified or removed if determined unfit or unhealthy
- ❗ Animals with any illness will not be allowed to unload and you will be asked to take your animal home
- ❗ Please contact a veterinarian if your animal has any problems before bringing it to Achievement Days

LAMOURE COUNTY ANIMAL WELFARE GUIDELINES

- ❗ The LaMoure County 4-H program encourages the humane treatment of animals. 4-H'ers are responsible for the welfare of their animals. Exhibitors will provide their own feed, water and bedding for the comfort of their animals.
- ❗ Humane treatment is expected, abuse will not be tolerated. Exhibitors are expected to handle their animals in a gentle, calm manner.
- ❗ Pre-show practice and grooming preparation at home will ensure you and your animal have a better experience at Achievement Days. Preparations should be made at home to familiarize animals with changes in their environment.
- ❗ The Extension County Chair will serve as a spokesman for 4-H animal care if there are questions.

OPTIONS FOR EXHIBITING LIVESTOCK

As a LaMoure County 4-H'er showing livestock, you have the choice of showing animals at LaMoure County Achievement Days in LaMoure on Wednesday, June 27th **OR** at the Dickey County Fair Livestock Show on July 14th. If showing in Dickey County, all LaMoure County animals will compete as LaMoure County 4-H'ers in the company of Dickey County 4-H'ers. You will register using the Dickey County Livestock Registration Form (enclosed).

Following are some points to keep in mind:

- ❗ If you plan on exhibiting at the Dickey County Fair you will not be able to show the same animal in LaMoure County's Achievement Days Livestock Show.
- ❗ If you intend on showing poultry in Dickey County, make certain you arrive before 6PM on Thursday, July 12th. You can bring your exhibit before the show and take it home when finished.
- ❗ Livestock exhibitors are to unload livestock at 3:30 pm on Friday, July 13th and they may be removed after the show.
 - There should be signage saying 'livestock unloading' which is by the wash racks
- ❗ LaMoure County exhibitors are not eligible to compete in Dickey County's Round Robin nor are they eligible for Dickey County premiums.
- ❗ If you choose to show in LaMoure, please follow the guidelines and schedule listed in this supplement.
- ❗ Youth Quality Care Assurance (YQCA): YQCA is an exciting opportunity to help educate young people in North Dakota on the importance of food safety and proper animal care as they work with their project animals diligently preparing them for their county fairs, achievement days and the North Dakota State Fair. YQCA certification is mandatory for LaMoure County 4-H'ers exhibiting livestock in Dickey County and at the North Dakota State Fair. YQCA is recommended, but not required for youth exhibiting animals in LaMoure County.

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR ANIMAL EXHIBITORS

- 🔑 LaMoure County uses rules stated in the **ND State Fair 4-H Division Exhibit List**
- 🔑 Use Division and Class numbers listed in this supplement or the ND State Fair 4-H Division Exhibit List
- 🔑 A 4-H member must exhibit his or her own animal
- 🔑 Exhibitors may be asked questions when the animals are exhibited
 - 🔑 Animal's name, age, sex and weight
 - 🔑 Animal anatomy
 - 🔑 Answer questions in complete sentences
 - 🔑 If you don't know, a polite answer is, "I'm sorry, but I don't know that answer."
- 🔑 At the conclusion of the small and large animal shows, an overall premium ribbon can be awarded at the judge's discretion.

- 🔑 Livestock Showmanship contests will be held **ONLY** at the Dickey County Fair
- 🔑 Livestock Showmanship is outlined in the 4-H Showmanship and Grooming literature
- 🔑 Judging begins as animals are brought into the ring
- 🔑 There will be a Grand Champion Showmanship Contest for each species
- 🔑 There will be no Round Robin Contest

ALL STALLS/CAGES MUST BE CLEANED AFTER THE SHOW
4-H'ers are asked to take straw, hay, and other materials home with them.
Member's premium checks will not be issued if stalls are not cleaned.

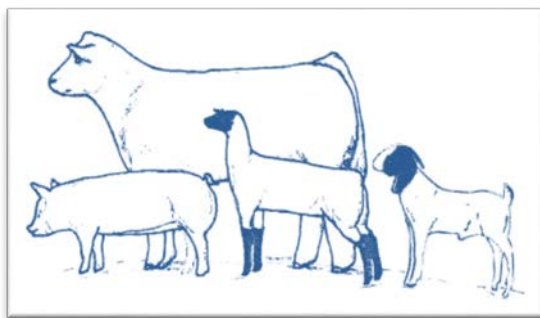

Recipients will receive the name and address of the sponsor at exhibit checkout. Please scan or photograph your thank you note(s) and e-mail to NDSU Extension Service-LaMoure County prior to **August 15, 2018**. Extension staff will then mail the cash premium directly to the 4-H'er. If a 4-H'er chooses not to submit a thank you note by August 15, 2018, her/his cash premium will be forfeited and returned to the 4-H Council.

LIVESTOCK SHOWMANSHIP



Showmanship Tips:

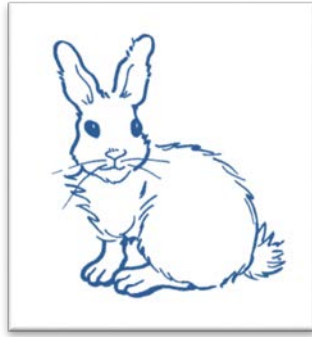
- 📌 Be courteous and show good sportsmanship at all times
- 📌 Use soft voice commands with your animal
- 📌 Show confidence: the judge is judging you along with your animal
- 📌 Keep your focus: be alert to the judge, keep your eye on the judge and smile
- 📌 Your animal should be clean and well groomed
- 📌 Halters and leads need to be clean, in good repair and well fitting
- 📌 Respect your animal: you may be dismissed from the show if you become angry or mistreat your animal

Show Ring Tips:

- 📌 When you enter the ring, you will walk on parade and keep an animal length apart. You will be asked to reverse direction
- 📌 Walk with your lead held properly
- 📌 Never drag your animal
- 📌 Never pass the animal ahead of you on the inside, always pass out of the line of the judges' view unless the ring steward tells you to do so; keep your proper distance
- 📌 Hold the lead rope about eight inches down from the snap - **never hold onto the snap**
- 📌 Don't talk to the judge unless they speak to you first
- 📌 You may speak to the ring steward if absolutely necessary
- 📌 Keep showing even if the judge is at the other end, they may be watching you out of the corner of their eye
- 📌 Never talk to another show person, it is poor manners and distracting
- 📌 If your animal is nervous, do the best you can, the judge knows animals can be nervous
- 📌 As the judge moves around your animal, you also move around your animal so you are never between your animal and the judge
- 📌 After the judge makes his or her selections, you will be called out and placed
- 📌 Always be showing! Judges may change their mind after they see how they have lined up the places

Whatever Placing You Receive, Remember it is only one person's (the judge's) opinion on that particular day. Leave the show ring just as proudly as you entered; knowing you did the very best you could on that day. Some of the audience will be watching you all the way out because you were their favorite! Have a good time and remember why you are out there showing...to learn and have fun!!!

RABBIT SHOWMANSHIP



Below are a few items to keep in mind when showing a rabbit at Achievement Days

- 👤 If you have more than one rabbit, select your best rabbit for show
- 👤 Make sure your rabbit is healthy
- 👤 Trim toe nails one week before the show
- 👤 Groom rabbit the day before and again at the show, especially for rabbits with long coats
- 👤 Wiping your rabbit with a wet wipe shortly before showing will create a luminous, soft coat
- 👤 Keep the rabbit's pen clean: a clean pen makes a clean rabbit
- 👤 Handle your rabbit frequently to get your rabbit used to being handled, both you and the judge will handle it at the show table
- 👤 Work with your rabbit on posing properly (Youtube.com has many "how-to" videos)
- 👤 When registering for Achievement Days, use the State Fair 4-H Exhibit List for class codes for breeds

Be Sure to Know:

- 👤 Breed
- 👤 Age
- 👤 Color
- 👤 Sex

Proper Behavior:

- 👤 Be confident, not arrogant
- 👤 Avoid talking to your rabbit excessively during showmanship
- 👤 If the rabbit begins to wander, just cover its eyes with one hand
- 👤 Smile, smile, smile, 😊

POULTRY REQUIREMENTS



If you are planning on exhibiting birds in North Dakota, you have one of three choices:

1. Become a National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP) flock

OR

2. Test exhibition birds on or before June 13, 2018

- Julianne Racine, County Ag Agent, is certified as a Poultry Testing Agent
- Contact NDSU Extension Service - LaMoure County to schedule an appointment
- Testing through Julianne must be completed by June 13, 2018

OR

3. Purchase exhibition birds from NPIP sources (flock, hatchery or retail location selling from an NPIP-approved source)

AND

a. Complete a Poultry Exhibition Statement of Origin form SFN 60329 (2-2013), including required signatures. This form must accompany the birds to exhibits/shows.

AND

b. Have the birds banded prior to exhibition.

- Chickens, turkeys and game birds, except baby poultry, must be individually identified with a leg or wing band.
