

North Dakota Gross Domestic Product by Industry: 2007


North Dakota gross domestic product (GDP) grew to \$27.7 billion in 2007 (Figure 1 and Table 1), representing 0.2 percent of GDP nationwide (Figure 2). GDP values in this publication are presented in current dollars (i.e., not adjusted for inflation). To view GDP in real dollars (i.e., adjusted for inflation), visit www.bea.gov/regional/gsp.

In North Dakota, the government sector comprised 15.0 percent of the total GDP in 2007. Manufacturing captured 9.5 percent of the state's total GDP, followed by health care and social assistance (8.6 percent) and real estate, rental, and leasing (8.1 percent) (Figure 1).

According to the Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA), GDP by state is the state counterpart of the nation's gross domestic product, BEA's featured measure of U.S. output. GDP by state is the value added in production by the labor and capital located in a state. In concept, an industry's GDP by state, referred to as its value added, is equivalent to its gross output (sales or receipts and other operating income, commodity taxes, and inventory change) minus its intermediate inputs (consumption of goods and services purchased from other

North Dakota Gross Domestic Product Reaches \$27.7 billion

Current-dollar gross domestic product (GDP) was \$27.7 billion for North Dakota in 2007. The

government sector comprised 15.0 percent of North Dakota's total GDP. Manufacturing captured 9.5

percent of the state's total GDP, followed by health care and social assistance (8.6 percent) and real

estate, rental, and leasing (8.1 percent).

This month's "Economic Brief," a monthly publication from the North Dakota State Data Center at

North Dakota State University, focuses on state gross domestic product by industry sector. According to

the Bureau of Economic Analysis, gross domestic product by state, considered the state counterpart of

the nation's gross domestic product, is the value added in production by the labor and capital located in

a state.

When combined, California, Texas, and New York captured approximately 30 percent of total

GDP in 2007. North Dakota, along with South Dakota, Montana, Wyoming, and Vermont, each

captured 0.2 percent.

After adjusting for inflation, North Dakota's real-dollar GDP grew 3.0 percent from 2006 to

2007. "About one-third of the growth can be attributed to two economic sectors in the state: mining

(including oil and gas extraction) and information," said Richard Rathge, Director of the State Data

Center. "An additional 28 percent of the growth is due to retail trade and durable goods manufacturing.

Agriculture accounted for only 3 percent of the growth in real GDP, due largely to high input costs," said

Rathge.
