

## Annual Population for North Dakota: April 1, Census 2000 to the July 1, 2009 Estimate

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, current population estimates indicate that North Dakota's population was 646,844 in 2009, up 0.8 percent from 641,421 in 2008 (Table 1). Readers may notice that the 2008 estimate of 641,421 differs from the 2008 estimate released one year ago. It is important to recognize that most administrative record data sources used in calculating these estimates lag the current estimate year by up to two years. As updated data become available, the past years' estimates are revised so that the current year is always based on the most recent data available. In North Dakota, population grew in 20 counties from 2008 to 2009 (Figure 2). Billings County had the largest percentage growth (3.6 percent) followed by Mountrail and McKenzie counties (3.4 percent each). Eddy County showed the largest percentage decline during this period (-3.7 percent) followed by Foster County (-3.5 percent). Population in North Dakota continues to be centralized. The majority of North Dakotans (53.6 percent) reside in the top four populated counties (Cass, Burleigh, Grand Forks, and Ward), which is up from 49.4 percent in 2000.

Among all the states in 2009, North Dakota ranked 48<sup>th</sup> in total population and had the 23<sup>rd</sup> largest population growth rate from 2008 to 2009. Two states lost population during this time: Michigan (-0.3 percent) and Maine (-0.1 percent). The fastest growing states were Utah and Wyoming (2.1 percent each).



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## North Dakota's Population Surpasses 2000 Census

For the first time in the past nine years, North Dakota's population exceeded the 2000 census count of 642,200, reaching 646,844 in 2009.

The 2009 estimate is up 0.8 percent from 641,421 people in 2008.

This month's "Population Bulletin," a monthly publication from the North Dakota State Data Center at North Dakota State University, focuses on county population estimates recently released from the U.S. Census Bureau's Population Division.

In North Dakota, population grew in 20 counties from 2008 to 2009. Billings County had the largest percentage growth (3.6 percent) followed by Mountrail and McKenzie counties (3.4 percent each). Eddy County showed the largest percentage decline during this period (-3.7 percent) followed by Foster County (-3.5 percent).

"What is most impressive about the latest round of population estimates in North Dakota is the continued strength of population shifts in western North Dakota. Fourteen of the 19 growing counties in the state, based on these estimates, are in the western half of the state," said Richard Rathge, Director of the State Data Center.

The population in North Dakota continues to be centralized. The majority of North Dakotans (53.6 percent) reside in the top four populated counties (Cass, Burleigh, Grand Forks, and Ward), which is up from 49.4 percent in 2000.

Among all the states in 2009, North Dakota ranked 48<sup>th</sup> in total population and had the 23<sup>rd</sup> largest population growth rate from 2008 to 2009. Two states lost population during this time. Michigan's population was down -0.3 percent and Maine lost -0.1 percent of its population.

The fastest growing states were Utah and Wyoming (2.1 percent each).

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
