

HERBICIDE MOVEMENT

Herbicides that translocation will move to tubers and residues can accumulate in the eyes causing sprouting problems the next year.





EXPOSURE TO HERBICIDES

- Contact to herbicides can be from
 - Soil carryover
 - Drift
 - Volatilization
 - Inversions
 - Tank contamination
 - Spot spraying
 - Contaminated water

WHERE ARE HERBICIDES SPRAYED?

- Everywhere!!!
 - Neighboring fields
 - Prevented planted acreage
 - CRP land
 - Roadsides
 - Railroads
 - Lawns



IDEAS TO PROTECT SEED POTATOES

- Talk with neighbors
- Dedicate a sprayer for potatoes using only potato friendly herbicides
- Plant borders around fields
- Train employees about herbicide problems
- Walk field edges



HERBICIDE DAMAGE SUSPECTED

- Document injury symptoms and patterns
- Contact applicator
- Take pictures
- Send leaf tissue and tuber samples to lab
- Count damaged plants to determine the extent of injury
- Map areas of the field damaged
- MN: file complaint within 45 days of suspected incident; ND file within 28 days.
