Project Summary and Participation Summary

Forms submitted after the due date, **OCTOBER 1**, will not be judged and are ineligible for awards.


In order to make completion of the Project Summary and Participation Summary as easy as possible, we have listed a few guidelines to help you. By following these guidelines it will make it easier for the judges to be fair to all 4-H'ers.

- » Forms are to be hand written by the child and in the child's own words. The judges look at this.
- » Please remember to include your name, age, and club on EACH Project Summary (blue, pink, and white sheets).

- Experiences listed on the Project Summary form should relate directly to that project area only. Think back on all of the things you did during the past year.
