

Haskap and Honeyberry Sources

Honeyberries/haskaps need full or almost full sunlight to do their best. After planting, mulch and keep watered. Reduce watering towards Fall. Any soil that grows a garden is suitable. Keeps weeds and grass away from the plants. Rows: apx 12 ft apart. Plants: apx 4ft apart.

2 unrelated varieties are needed to produce a fruit crop. Except: Indigo Gem and Solo are self-fruitful. However, a better crop will be set with a second, unrelated pollinizing variety.

Birds LOVE honeyberries/Haskaps!! Net the plants 2 weeks after bloom is done.
