2018 Roughrider Days, Fair & Expo/Stark-Billings County 4-H Division**Rules and Guidelines****General:**

1. Members will be allowed to exhibit only in the 4-H projects in which they are enrolled as of May 1, 2018. Exhibits should reflect the age of the members and years in the project. Exhibits must be from the current club year. Use the state fair 4-H exhibit list and the Roughrider Days, Fair & Expo 4-H Division Supplement for exhibit ideas. All exhibits entered will be interview judged.
2. 4-H members are encouraged to be creative in their exploration of 4-H projects. Exhibits should show this creativity. A 4-H'er may enter up to **two different exhibits per project, no duplicate items**. Exhibits must be from current club year and must relate to the project area.

Exhibits are not limited to items listed in the state fair book or Roughrider Days, Fair & Expo 4-H Division Supplement, as these are only suggestions. See exhibit ideas at:

www.ndsu.edu/4h/member_information/project_sheets/ Exhibit guidelines such as those found in foods and nutrition, photography and garden items need to be followed and are listed in the state fair exhibit list for specific projects. **Note:** Two different items may be exhibited per project. Duplicate items will not be accepted.

3. 4-H'ers unable to attend Roughrider Days, Fair & Expo 4-H Division may have their exhibit judged if they complete an absentee interview judging form and attach it to their project. This form is available at the Extension office or find the form online at ndsu.ag/starkcountyextension Absentee exhibits are eligible for only blue, red and white ribbons unless exhibitor is part of a school-sponsored national trip and has permission from county Extension agents. These exhibits will be accepted at the county Extension office until 3 p.m. on June 22.
4. Exhibits must be registered on entry forms provided. Exhibits not registered by June 11 are eligible for only blue, red and white ribbons. No special awards will be awarded unless exhibits are registered.
5. Ribbons must remain on non-living exhibits until they are removed from the exhibit area during the last day of Roughrider Days, Fair & Expo 4-H Division. All exhibits must remain until release time on June 28.
6. A 4-H member's county dues for current club year must be paid by June 1 of the current year.
7. Each member will be responsible for entering, displaying and picking up his/her own exhibits.
8. Projects made in school or a classroom setting will not be accepted for exhibit at Roughrider Days, Fair & Expo 4-H Division. Exhibits judged at previous contests are not eligible for judging again.
9. Exhibits must meet requirements as listed in the state fair book and Roughrider Days, Fair & Expo 4-H Division Supplement. Exhibits not meeting requirements may be lowered one or more ribbon placing at the discretion of the judge.
10. 4-H members, leaders and individuals are not allowed in the Non-Living Exhibit areas (June 25 from 5 to 7 p.m.) when judges determine superior, reserve and grand champion exhibits. These awards are given at the judges' discretion.
11. Exhibit tags must be securely attached to each exhibit. Tags will be printed for registered exhibits. Tags for exhibits not registered will be available at entry time.

12. County Dress Code Policy for Roughrider Days, Fair & Expo 4-H Division will be: "All 4-H participants/exhibitors must be neatly dressed and must wear a solid colored white, yellow, gray or green shirt/blouse with the 4-H emblem prominently displayed and securely fastened on the front. Participants/exhibitors should wear dark jeans/slacks/skirts, and livestock exhibitors should wear boots/protective shoes for safety. Participants in the 4-H horse show have some additional dress code requirements; please see the horse show rules guide GBH092 pg. 9-16. **NOTE:** 2011 yellow county 4-H t-shirts, 2012 navy shirts; 2013 blue shirts; 2014 pink or black shirts, 2015 burgundy, and 2016 gray, 2017 green county 4-H shirts are acceptable for county events only excluding horse show.

Exhibitors not following the dress code may receive a reduced ribbon placing. Any changes in ribbon placing are at the judge's discretion. 4-H emblem patches can be purchased from the county Extension office for \$1.

13. Dual enrollment: Youth must not enroll in the same project area in multiple county programs. Dual enrolled youth members must designate a single county in which they plan to participate in animal/premium sales. Dual enrolled youth cannot participate in more than one county animal/premium sale.
- 14. Sponsor appreciation: All trophy winners are required to personally thank sponsors. This should be done by a letter and, if possible, a personal "thank you." Let them know how much you appreciate their sponsorship and support of the 4-H program. Proof of a thank you note prior to a 4-H member receiving their premium money is required.**
15. A 4-H Family Picnic will be held 6:30 p.m., Thursday, June 28, at the DSU Indoor Arena. All 4-H members and their families and 4-H Livestock Premium Sale buyers are welcome. Reserve the number of tickets your family needs on the non-living exhibit entry form. Picnic tickets required.
16. No dogs allowed on the premises.

Cloverbud:

1. Exhibitors ages 5-7 by September 1, 2017, are Cloverbud members and use enclosed entry forms to register exhibits. 4-H'ers must register by June 11 on these entry forms or find them online at ndsu.ag/starkcountyextension
2. Non-Living Exhibits: Cloverbud members may enter two non-living exhibits on June 25.
3. 4-H Horse Show: Cloverbud members may participate in the 4-H Horse Show on June 26. They may enter Showmanship at Halter, Western Pleasure, Pole Bending, and Barrel Racing only. Cloverbud members will receive a participation ribbon. Not eligible for state contest. See "Horse" rules on the next page.
4. Clothing Revue & Project Expo: Cloverbud members may enter one exhibit at the Clothing Revue and Project Expo, Cloverbud category. See "4-H Clothing Revue & Project Expo" rules, pg. 6 in this booklet.
5. Poultry and Rabbits: Cloverbud members may exhibit one in the Poultry and Rabbit Show on Wednesday, June 27.

6. Cloverbud Livestock: Cloverbud members may participate in only one of the following species: swine, sheep, goats, beef, and dairy. Individuals showing a beef or dairy animal must exhibit an animal born March 1, 2018, or later. Exhibits will receive a participation ribbon only. Cloverbud exhibitors are limited to one entry in the Livestock Show. Animals exhibited by Cloverbud members are not eligible for the 4-H Premium Sale. Cloverbuds will exhibit their animals with that species during the livestock show.
7. Cloverbud Dog Show: Cloverbuds members may exhibit in the Dog show on Wednesday, June 27. Cloverbuds will receive participation ribbons only.
8. Cloverbud members will receive participation ribbons only. Premiums will be paid on up to three exhibits.
9. North Dakota State Fair: Cloverbud exhibits are **NOT** eligible for entry at the ND State Fair.

Horse:

1. All participants must be currently enrolled in a 4-H horse project.
2. General rules for showing in all classes and lots will be according to GBH092 (dated May 2012). Chain lead shank under jaw is permitted in showmanship at halter. Patterns to be used include:

Lot 1441 and 1442 (ages 8-11, 12-14)
Reining pattern #2, GBH092, pg. 33

Lot 1443 (ages 15-18)
Reining Pattern #6, GBH092 pg. 37
3. A blue ribbon at a county show is required for each event a participant enters at the state fair. Participants will be allowed to get their blue ribbon at multiple shows if needed. For example, Sally receives a blue ribbon at Show A in showmanship at halter, western horsemanship, barrels and poles. She then receives a blue ribbon in trail at Show B. She can now enter all five events at the state fair. The state fair horse stall reservation form may be used to record when those ribbons were earned. It is on the North Dakota 4-H website www.ndsu.edu/4h, under programs and events, then State Fair.
4. 4-H'ers must register by June 11 on the enclosed entry form or find the form online at ndsu.ag/starkcountyextension Lot changes can be made prior to the show.
5. Dress code: see GBH092, "North Dakota 4-H Horse Show Rules and Judging Guide," pg. 9-16.
6. Exhibitors will be divided into four age groups: Cloverbuds; 8 to 11; 12 to 14; and 15 to 18. Age group will be determined as of September 1, 2017. See pg. 4 for Cloverbud participation.
7. A horse will be exhibited only once in a lot. This applies to joint ownership of a horse. Once a horse has been exhibited in a lot, it cannot again be exhibited in that same lot. Each 4-H member is limited to a maximum of two horses for showing at the county event.
8. If a horse becomes unruly in the arena, the horse and exhibitor will be asked to leave. No stud horses will be permitted.
9. Broken patterns in timed events will result in "no time." No re-runs if pattern is broken. Ties in timed events will be broken by re-runs.
10. Helmets are required for all 4-H members mounted on their horses inside or outside of the arena.

11. For barrels and poles, all starts and stops must be made within the designated area. Knocking over a barrel or pole shall cause an automatic 5-second penalty per incident. 5-second penalty assessed for horse being led into the arena past the plane of the in-gate. Failure to follow course shall be cause for disqualification.
12. Trophies, rosettes and ribbons will be awarded. A blue ribbon is required for participation at the State Fair 4-H Horse Show for each event a participant enters at the state fair.
- 13. 4-H'ers who plan to participate in this year's horse show must participate in a 4-H horse interview at the Roughrider Days, Fair & Expo/4-H Division on June 25.** Horse record forms will be required during horse project interviews. These record forms are available at the county Extension office, online at ndsuhq.org/starkcountyextension. 4-H'ers must register by June 11 on the enclosed entry form or find the form online at ndsuhq.org/starkcountyextension. Contestant numbers will be issued at the livestock registration table following interviews on June 25
14. Winners of the 12 to 14 and 15 to 18 age group showmanship at halter will advance to the Round Robin Livestock Showmanship Contest on June 28 in the junior and senior divisions.
15. Classes included in overall horsemanship award scoring include: showmanship at halter, western horsemanship, western pleasure, trail, reining, and ranch riding.
16. No dogs allowed on the premises.

4-H Clothing Revue & Project Expo:

1. 4-H participants must register by June 11 on the enclosed entry form or find the form online at ndsuhq.org/starkcountyextension. See state fair book pg. 23 for lot numbers.
2. This is an opportunity for 4-H members to participate in the display of exhibits for the **Clothing Revue** (Buy & Show, Sew & Show, Decorate Your Duds) **and Project Expo**.
3. The event will be June 25 at the Biesiot Activities Center. 4-H members must report to the registration table at the Biesiot Activities Center at 5:30 p.m. for instructions on display table location, etc. All display setup should be completed by 5:45 p.m. and judging will begin at 5:45. Project Expo displays can be taken down at the non-living exhibit release time on June 28.
4. Project Expo exhibits must relate to a project in which participants are enrolled.
5. All Clothing Revue participants must be enrolled in a clothing-related project.
6. Decorate Your Duds category: Clothing items can be purchased or sewn.
7. Age is determined as of September 1, 2017. Exhibit divisions are: Cloverbud (age 5-7); Preteen (ages 8 to 12); Teen (ages 13 to 18).
8. 4-H youth may exhibit in Project Expo and one Clothing Revue category. **4-H members cannot enter other exhibits already judged as non-living exhibits in Clothing Revue or Project Expo.**
9. Participants in the Project Expo need to provide their own equipment. Teen Clothing Revue participants are required to construct their entire outfit. Preteen Clothing Revue participants

must construct at least one-half or more of their outfit. 4-H members must bring the printed pattern guide for their project.

10. Project Expo participants must follow the 4-H dress code (see pg. 4). Clothing Revue (Sew & Show, Buy & Show, Decorate Your Duds) participants will wear their exhibit.
11. 4-H members selected as division winners in the Preteen and Teen divisions of the Clothing Revue and the Project Expo will advance to the state contests at the state fair. Find more information on this event at: www.ndsu.edu/4h/programs_events/state_4_h_contests/

Livestock/Rabbits and Poultry:

1. **All livestock exhibitors, including poultry and rabbits, must participate in a livestock interview held on Monday, June 25, in order to exhibit their animal.** No ribbons will be awarded in the livestock interview.

Livestock record forms will be required during livestock project interviews. These record forms are available at the county Extension office, online at ndsu.ag/starkcountyextension or using the 4-H Livestock Record app available for Apple products. Photo albums with additional pictures and other project information may be brought for display only; they won't be used during interview judging.

2. 4-H'ers must register by June 11 on the enclosed entry form or find the form online at ndsu.ag/starkcountyextension for 1) livestock; 2) horse; 3) poultry and rabbits. Contestant numbers and stall cards will be issued at the livestock registration table following livestock interviews on June 25. Participants can also pick up contestant numbers and livestock stall cards at the information table at the livestock arena beginning at 7:00 a.m. on June 28.
3. Livestock exhibitors are limited to two entries per lot and a total of six animals per species. Rabbit and poultry exhibitors may enter twice in each lot in each breed and are limited to 12 entries. **Please use county supplement for county lot numbers (see page 11).** The state fair book is used when entering exhibits at the state fair.
4. Market steers, lambs and hogs will be weighed upon arrival at the arena; see *Schedule of Events*, page 2 in this booklet.
5. Two age divisions will be used in livestock showmanship (age as of September 1, 2017): senior: 13 years and older; and junior: 12 and under. Junior and senior winners will advance to the overall (round robin) showmanship competition which is held at the completion of livestock judging. A junior and senior round robin will be held. Champion showmen in horse, dairy, swine, beef, goats and sheep are eligible. A 4-H'er who has previously received the overall senior showmanship award can compete for the award in another year only if they show and qualify in a different livestock species. Reserve champion showman in a livestock species may substitute if the champion can't or chooses not to participate.
6. Livestock that are untrained and not kept under control will be removed from the judging ring. 4-H members are encouraged to show their own exhibits. Livestock committee members will be available to assist younger members with their animals.
7. International Association of Fairs & Expositions (IAFE) National Code of Ethics will be followed. Refer to page 4 of the 2018 North Dakota State Fair Exhibit List for more information.
8. All breeding sheep and goats are required to have a scrapie identification tag.

9. Exhibition/Show Poultry Guidance: If you plan to exhibit birds in North Dakota, have the birds banded prior to exhibition. Chickens, turkeys and game birds (except baby poultry) must be individually identified with a leg or wing band.
AND, you have three choices (follow on page 8)
 1. Become a National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP) flock; OR
 2. Test exhibition birds within 90 days of the exhibition; OR
 3. Purchase exhibition birds from NPIP sources (flock, hatchery, or retail location selling from an NPIP approved source); AND complete a Poultry Exhibition Statement of Origin form (SFN 60329 (2-2013) including required signatures. This form must accompany the birds to exhibits/shows. The form can be found on North Dakota Department of Agriculture's website: www.nd.gov/ndda/program/national-poultry-improvement-plan
10. Poultry must be at least 4 months old
11. A 4-H Family Picnic will be held following the premium sale, Thursday, June 28, at the DSU Indoor Arena. All 4-H members and their families and 4-H Livestock Premium Sale buyers are welcome. Reserve the number of tickets your family needs on the Non-Living Exhibit entry form. Picnic tickets required.
12. Dogs are only allowed on the premises during the county dog show on June 27.

Dog Show:

1. Rabies vaccination at minimum (proof of vaccination is required)
2. An exhibitor may enter no more than two (2) animals.
3. 4-H'ers may share a family dog provided it is entered only once per lot.
4. The dog shown must be owned by the immediate family by May 1 of the current year.
5. Nylon/leather collars for care and grooming and choker chains for obedience are the only equipment allowed during competition. No other adornment or attire will be worn by the dog while being judged.
6. No unruly dogs will be allowed in the show.
7. Dogs must be five months or older.
8. Dog exhibitors and animals will be judged on handling and grooming.
9. Dog exhibitors will not participate in the 4-H Premium Sale

Premium Sale:

1. **Members participating in the Livestock Premium Sale must assist with set up and tear down of arena locations. Jobs descriptions are available from the Extension office and on the volunteer signup sheet enclosed with this booklet. Also find the form online at nds.uag/starkcountyextension If volunteer help for setup and clean up at the 2018 Roughrider Days Fair & Expo/4-H Division does not improve, the 4-H council may decide to withhold any or all premiums from members not volunteering.**
2. Premiums for unruly animals removed from judging will not be sold at the 4-H Livestock Premium Sale.

3. A 4-H member may sell only one premium at the 4-H Livestock Premium Sale. 4-H members are encouraged to select grand, reserve, superior, blue or red ribbon placed animals. 4-H'ers must register before 1 p.m. on Thursday, June 28. Exhibitors will receive an entry form at the livestock registration table following livestock record judging. Also, find the form online at ndsu.ag/starkcountyextension
4. 2018 Premium Sale livestock species order will be: 1) sheep, 2) poultry, 3) horse, 4) dairy, 5) goat, 6) rabbit, 7) beef and 8) swine. Species order rotates each year. Grand champion exhibits for all species will be sold during the 4-H Premium Sale followed by all reserve exhibits, all superior, blue ribbon and red ribbon exhibits.
5. Exhibitors at the 4-H Livestock Premium Sale will forfeit ribbon premium money (see 4-H Premium Money, pg. 10).
6. Exhibitor must be present to participate with his/her own animal in the sale.
7. **Exhibitors entering horses in the premium sale must lead their horse. No riding or running is allowed in the sales ring or building.**
8. Dual enrollment: Dual enrolled youth members must designate a single county in which they plan to participate in animal/premium sales. Dual enrolled youth cannot participate in more than one county animal/premium sale.
9. **Sponsor appreciation: All recipients of premium money should thank premium sale buyers. This should be done by a letter and, if possible, a personal "thank you." Let them know how much you appreciate their sponsorship and support of the 4-H program. Proof of a thank you note prior to a 4-H member receiving their premium money is required.**
10. No dogs allowed on the premises.

North Dakota State Fair:

1. Non-Living items receiving blue ribbon awards at the Roughrider Days Fair & Expo/4-H Division are eligible for entry at the North Dakota State Fair.
2. Follow state fair guidelines in the North Dakota State Fair Exhibit List. Only two items per class are allowed at the state fair.
3. Cloverbud exhibits are not eligible for entry at the North Dakota State Fair.
4. Non-Living exhibits intended for the state fair, along with state fair entry forms, can be brought directly from the Biesiot Activities Center to the Extension office at exhibit release time on Thursday, June 28. Otherwise, items are due in the Extension office by 12 Noon on Wednesday, July 11. 4-H'ers must register on the enclosed entry form or find the form online at ndsu.ag/starkcountyextension
5. Roughrider Days Fair & Expo/4-H Division exhibit tags should remain intact on items intended for state fair entry.
6. Items that cannot easily be carried by two people (size or weight) will not be accepted. Fragile items are best left at home.
7. Reminder: Follow State Fair 4-H Division Exhibit List guidelines for each exhibit including livestock entries.

8. Livestock Entries will be made online or with the form used for open class. Entries must be in the State Fair office by Thursday, July 5. Enter online at www.ndstatefair.com, then click exhibit. **Members wishing to exhibit livestock (except horses) at the State Fair must be YQCA trained.**
9. All horse entries must register/enter through the North Dakota State Fair. Entries are due by July 5.

4-H Premium Money:

1. Premium money will be combined with state fair exhibit premium money and will be available in one check to each 4-H member after 9/1/18. Exhibits in the Roughrider Days Fair & Expo/4-H Division will receive premium money for award ribbons as follows:
