

North Dakota Tree Selector

Coffeetree, Kentucky - *Gymnocladus dioicus*

A medium to large tree with a graceful, upward spreading canopy. Native to eastern United States as far west as southern Minnesota and eastern South Dakota. Adapted across North Dakota south of Interstate 94. With increased interest in tree diversity, it has potential for use in community tree plantings.

Kentucky Coffeetree is considered a borderline hardy tree for North Dakota, so plant only trees with a known hardy seed source.
