North Dakota Tree Selector

Arborvitae, American - Thuja occidentalis

A small to medium upright tree with a stout, buttressed trunk, native to Minnesota. Compact dwarf cultivars are widely used in landscapes. The tree is hardy in all zones but prefers a semi-moist site. Other common names are whitecedar and eastern arborvitae. An uncertain combination of winter conditions may cause infrequent winter injury in the Northern United States. The largest tree in North Dakota is 45 feet tall with a canopy spread of 30 feet. Compatibility with power lines depends on variety that is planted.
