Description

An open, spreading, multi-stemmed, medium to large shrub with horizontal branches at the base. Freely stoloniferous as it spreads by natural layering of lower, relatively prostrate stems. Dark, blood-red bark provides winter color. Responds well to rejuvenation pruning when overgrown as it will resprout from roots.

Preferences

Light: Full sun to part shade.

Water: Medium to high.

Soil: Tolerates a wide range including wet.

Comments

Several cultivated varieties are available, including:

'Bergeson Compact' Dogwood - Superior red twigs; fall color and density.

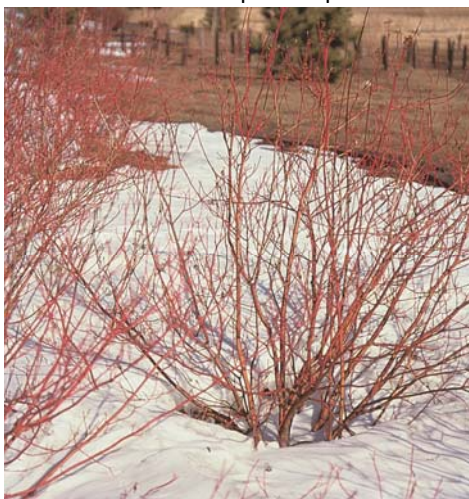
'Cardinal' Dogwood - Coral-red twigs; fall color and density of mediocre quality.

'Isanti' Dogwood - A multi-stem shrub with a dense, compact habit.

'Silver and Gold' or 'Ivory Halo' Dogwood - Variegated leaves and yellow twigs.

'Yellowtwig' Dogwood - Yellow stems, often sunscald in winter.
